

Marc Holderied and I attended a 'jamming session' on bat echolocation organised by Brock Fenton at Lamanai Outpost Lodge, Belize between 16-23 April 2007. The meeting was one of the best attended by echolocation specialists from around the world in recent years. I travelled light with my Canon 1D Mark IIN camera, a 100-400mm IS zoom lens, 100mm macro lens, 17-40mm zoom and my lightweight Leitz 8x32 binoculars. Although there are many excellent bird guides available for Central America, H. Lee Jones' 'Birds of Belize' proved excellent, and did not include lots of Central American species not found in Belize. We stayed in the Embassy Suites Near Miami Airport on 15 April. A powerful storm was hitting the NE US, and its tail brought heavy rain and strong winds to Miami. The area around the hotel was not great for birding, and we managed the following species:

We flew to Belize City on 16th, and set off to Lamanai Outpost Lodge, travelling up the New River by boat. We spent the next week at Lamanai, catching bats in the evening and having time for birding and visiting the Mayan ruins in the day. We saw the following birds:

1. Anhinga – several on the New River
2. Neotropic cormorant – common
3. Least bittern - 1 opposite Lamanai
4. Green heron – common
5. Boat-billed heron = 1 at dawn opposite Lamanai
6. Black-crowned night heron – 1-2 over river from Lamanai
7. Yellow crowned night heron – juvenile opposite Lamanai
8. Limpkin – fairly common
9. Great blue heron – fairly common. One white morph.
10. Jabiru – 1 breeding pair and 3 others seen

11. Wood stork – several
12. Great egret – common
13. Tricolored heron – several
14. Little blue heron – several
15. Snowy egret = common
16. Cattle egret – often flying over
17. White ibis – some flocks
18. Turkey vulture
19. Lesser yellow-headed vulture – at least 2, Lamaani

31. Black-necked stilt – in flight over Lamaanai
32. Spotted sandpiper – common, New River
33. Solitary sandpiper – one near ruins landing
34. Laughing gull – seen on trip up river
35. Pale-vented pigeon – camera
36. Short-billed pigeon – seen on trip up river
37. Ruddy ground dove - common
38. Blue ground dove – one, opposite Lamaanai
39. White crowned parrot – common
40. Red-lored parrot – around lodge
41. Olive-throated parakeet – near ruins
42. Yellow-billed cuckoo – one near lodge
43. Groove-billed ani – several arpund ;odge
44. Northern potoo – one at ruins car park
45. Rufous-tailed hummingbird – common
46. Stripe-throated hermit – near museum
47. Violaceous trogon
48. Black-headed trogon
49. Rufous-tailed jacamar – one, forest near Sugar Mill
50. Collared aracari – group around ruins
51. Keel-billed toucans – 1 lodge, 2 Sugar Mill
52. Belted kingfisher - one near airport
53. Ringed kingfisher - common on river. Shy.
54. Green kingfisher – several on river.
55. American pigmy kingfisher – 2 opposite Lamaanai.
56. Golden-fronted woodpecker– several.
57. Golden-olive woodpecker – one around lodge
58. Pale-billed woodpecker – 1, Sugar Mill
59. Olivaceous woodcreeper – near ruins
60. Ivory-billed woodcreeper – 1, forest near Sugar Mill

61. Vermillion flycatcher – several around airport
62. Alder or Willow flycatcher – farmland around Lamanai, near ruins
63. Dusky-capped flycatcher - farmland around Lamanai and near museum
64. Scissor-tailed flycatcher – road to airport and over river from Lamanai
65. Sulphur-bellied flycatcher – near museum
66. Tropical kingbird - Lamanai
67. Couch's kingbird – airport
68. Social flycatcher – common
69. Great kiskadee – airport
70. Boat-billed flycatcher - farmland around Lamanai
71. Masked tityra – 1-2 around ruins
72. Philadelphia vireo – near ruins
73. Mangrove vireo – heard on boat trip
74. Red-eyed vireo - farmland around Lamanai
75. Lesser greenlet – near ruins
76. Blue-grey gnatcatcher – over river from Lamanai
